About the Gallery

The Arts Advocates Gallery is located in The Crossings at Siesta Key mall (corner of Siesta Drive and South Tamiami Trail/US 41). Enter the mall by Connors Steak & Seafood and turn left.

Currently on exhibit at the Arts Advocates Gallery are more than 25 pieces from our collection of renowned works by the Sarasota Artist Colony. In the 1930s, these artists began migrating to Sarasota inspired by its natural beauty. They were also drawn by the arrival of noted art collector John Ringling, whose colorful and dynamic circus acts inspired many paintings and sculptures.

Also on view are five paintings by the Florida Highwaymen. The Highwaymen were a group of 26 African American artists, including one woman, who were mostly self-taught and painted in Florida from the 1950s on for several decades. Because they were not invited to show their work in galleries, they sold their work from their cars along US 1 and AIA.

Over the years, our works of art have been on display at the Van Wezel Performing Arts Hall and continue to be shown there as well.

The exhibit at the gallery is open to the public every Saturday from 2:00-4:00 pm with a free docent tour at 3:00 pm. No appointment is required.
