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FROM YOUR PRESIDENT



as well as the music and the movement. I began lessons at age five and continued them for nine years. My interest has never waned, and I have been fortunate to have had the opportunity to see many outstanding professional performances. I have been involved in a variety of non-profit organizations, but no others have been as satisfying on a personal level as Arts Advocates. MEMBER ARTIST EXHIBIT **CECILE MORAN**

The Arts Advocates December Gallery Exhibition proudly showcases the work of Cecile Moran.

Raised in New England, Cecile studied at the Swain School of Design in New Bedford, Massachusetts, and the School of the Museum of Fine Arts, Boston. She earned a Bachelor of Fine Arts Degree from Boston University's College of Fine Art. There, she was influenced by the dynamic teaching of Romantic Surrealist artist Karl Fortess plus the Boston Expressionists, Reed Kay and Jack Kramer.

After graduation from Boston University, Cecile taught and studied in Madrid, Spain, for three years. The rich experience of living in Spain and travelling in Europe inspired her own art. Returning to the United States, she completed study for her Master of Arts Degree from California State University.

Influenced by the vibrancy of Mexican art, her painting began to reflect a strong use of color. She began to develop the painting technique she calls "Acrylic Resist," which she uses today.

Her art is often imbued with the use of gold leaf, a process she learned from her father, a sign painter and calligrapher. She is the third generation to carry on the use of gold leaf in her work:

The use of gold in the embellishment of small areas has been part of the work I created as a calligrapher; I now apply this technique to larger surfaces in my painting. Working with batik as well as painting led me to the use of the "resist" technique. With acrylic paint I can create a resist painting on top of the first layer of paint. I then paint a layer of differing color on top and remove the layer of resist to reveal new color relationships. The Indians of the

San Blas Islands created beautiful "Molas" using a reverse applique technique on fabric, similar to the effect my process creates with paint. Studying the interaction of color from this technique invigorated my creative process! The infusion of the gold leaf brings my paintings full circle.

Cecile's work is found in numerous collections in the United States and Spain and has been exhibited in Massachusetts, California, New York and Florida.



Cecile's opening reception is Saturday, December 2nd, from 2:00 to 4:00pm. The exhibit is open every Saturday from 2:00 to 4:00pm through December 30th. Come meet the artist and see samples of her extraordinary work!







ARTS ADVOCATES SCHOLARSHIP WINNERS

Where Are They Now?

Dr. Alexandra Dee

Conductor, Music Director and Educator

This month we are featuring a 2007 scholarship recipient, Dr. Alexandra Dee. Dr. Dee is the Director of Orchestral Activities in the Hayes School of Music at Appalachian State University, Music Director of the Asheville Symphony Youth Orchestra and Conductor of the Appalachian Community Orchestra. Dr. Dee is a Sarasota native and a graduate of Pine View High School.

After high school, Alexandra completed a Bachelor's Degree in Music Education and a Master's Degree of Music in Orchestral Conducting at Florida State University. She completed her Doctorate in Orchestral Conducting at Northwestern University's Bienen School of Music, where she studied with Victor Yapolsky. She went on to be the Director of Orchestral Activities at the University of St. Francis in Joliet, Illinois, and music director and conductor of Chicago's South Loop Symphony Orchestra. She also had the honor of serving as a cover conductor for the Joffrey Ballet, with whom she debuted in 2017 conducting the Chicago Philharmonic.

At the Asheville Community Orchestra, auditions are open to people thirteen years old and up, with no age limit at the top! She loves conducting the Community Orchestra because it brings together people of all ages. Other programs Dr. Dee promotes are specific to engaging children and families. After a performance, they have an "Instrument Petting Zoo," where children get the chance to see, touch, hear and sometimes even play different orchestra instruments.

The advice she gives to aspiring conductors/musicians is to be open to exposing yourself to as much music as you can. Go to concerts, even those that are not your favorites! Try to engage deeply with the music you are playing. The best advice she received was to become competent in the foundational skills and to have confidence in her personal skills as a musician.

Dr. Dee feels privileged to have grown up in a city like Sarasota that embraces the arts. Ken Bowermeister, her private music teacher and a conductor with the Sarasota Youth Orchestra, inspired her to take up conducting and pursue a career in music. "He was a wonderful teacher who, among other things, inspired me by having fun with music!"

with gouache paints. In the recent past, she added digital paintings to her portfolio, which allow her to stay creative when she travels and doesn't have access to her studios.


She found that the shapes of the pear, the female figure, and the coneflower so expressive that they keep appearing in her work.

THE BISHOP MUSEUM OF SCIENCE AND NATURE

We will tour the Bishop Museum which includes fossils, pottery and tools of early cultures as well as that of the Paleo-Indian culture. The second floor includes maritime as well as other artifacts from the Manatee River area and Tampa Bay, illustrating later settlement. Included in our tour is the Manatee rehab center, a planetarium show and the Mosaic Center. In addition, we will see an international photography exhibit of birds with award-winning photos.

Viktor is best known for some controversial styles of artwork, starting with his notable bullet painting series, Art or War. When creating these unique works, guns are as much a part of Viktor's process as paintbrushes, as he embellishes the images with bullet holes. EDUCATIONAL WORKSHOP

PLAYING WITH PASTELS

INSTRUCTOR: COSETTE KOSIBA

This workshop is for anyone interested in pastels, whether for the first time or with

previous experience. Learn about different types of surfaces that pastels can be applied onto, paper preparation, layering of color, mark making and how to protect your finished piece.

Materials: Please bring either a table easel or standing easel if you have one, plus drawing paper, photo reference, baby wipes, old towel, scissors, inexpensive paint brushes, plastic table cover, paper towels and a few plastic containers. Instructor will provide: Pre-cut pieces of Uart sandpaper, backing board, artist's tape, tracing paper, and a variety of soft pastels. There will be a still life set up for those who prefer not to work from a photo.
