The Scholarship recipients and their family members as well as many community guests were in attendance at the Luncheon held at Bird Key Yacht Club, May 16, 2019. Gabriel Hament of Cumberland Advisors, a participant in the event, said that audience members were treated to live violin, piano and trumpet performances by scholarship recipients. Young artists studying graphic design, painting, illustration and architecture presented their latest works. Over \$46,000 in scholarships were awarded to 13 high school and college students pursuing degrees in music, dance, and art and design. Locally, students from Booker High School, Pine View, Sarasota High School and Ringling College of Art and Design were well-represented and recognized for their achievements. The Fine Arts Society of Sarasota has given more than \$1 million in grants and scholarships in support of our local art community.

- Artistic director of the Vienna Radio Symphony Orchestra, the first woman to take up the prestigious role.
- Named one of "America's Most Powerful Women" by *Newsweek*. She can be heard as a commentator on *NPR*'s "**Marin on Music**."
- One of Leonard Bernstein's best-known pupils, Alsop was central to his 100th anniversary global celebrations in 2018, opening the London Symphony Orchestra performances of Bernstein's Mass at the Ravinia Festival.
