Dedicated to playing and supporting the music of contemporary composers, the ensemble performs innovative, thoughtfully curated programs to rave reviews. Hailed by the Chicago Tribune as an artist "full of subtlety and poise," Ms. Bennett also performs with the Dallas Opera Orchestra and frequently with the Fort Worth, Dallas and Boston symphonies. She is known for performances of some of the most challenging contemporary pieces.

George Nickson is the principal percussionist of the Dallas Symphony in addition to serving as percussion department chair and professor at Southern Methodist University. He also enjoys unique engagements with orchestras and recording groups across the country.

Last year the ensembleNEWSRQ company of artists performed at the Sarasota Opera House for the first time. In May of this year, the group takes the stage at The Ringling's Historic Asolo Theater in a concert

series that explores the works of artists inspired by the city of Paris.



Arts Advocates Gallery to Host Rare Highwaymen Exhibit

The Arts Advocates Board of Directors is thrilled to announce the exhibition of fifty Florida Highwaymen paintings in the Arts Advocates Gallery in The Crossings at Siesta Key mall, March 2-3 and March 22-24. The exhibition is being held in collaboration with Roger Lightle, noted Highwaymen art collector, along with Curtis Arnett, an Original Florida Highwayman, and Roy McLendon, Jr., son of an Original Highwayman. All pieces on display will be offered for sale. Some prints will also be available.

The Florida Highwaymen were prolific painters who sold their exquisite landscape paintings on Florida highways from the trunks of their cars, starting in the 1950s. These artists are now widely known and admired, and their artworks are collected and exhibited globally. In fact, five Highwaymen pieces are part of Arts Advocates' permanent collection.

This is a rare opportunity for the public to see such a large selection of Highwaymen artworks at one time and place. Be sure to come in to see the paintings, even if you don't plan to buy one! Those who do purchase an original piece will receive a free copy of Gary Monroe's book, The Highwaymen: Florida's African-American Landscape Painters.

In addition to the exhibition and sale, Roy will demonstrate his painting techniques live in the Gallery. Roger will be on hand to elaborate on his collection.

The exhibition is **free** and open to the public. No registration is necessary.

LYNN ARMSTRONG COFFIN — "FULL CIRCLE"

Lynn Armstrong Coffin received her BFA in Illustration and Graphic Design from the University of Georgia and began a diverse career in advertising. She has also worked as an upscale kitchen designer, written and illustrated children's books and sculpted political figures. Now Lynn has turned her skills to the world of contemporary art. She is proud to be exhibiting her most recent large scale works and prints at the Arts Advocates Gallery in March 2024.

The CIRCLE symbol in her latest works is used as a profound metaphor of the cyclical journey of life and our place in it. The circle always returns upon itself and is a strong graphic reminder that our actions today will have repercussions in the future.

With this in mind, and being concerned about the environment, she challenges herself to recycle and use discarded materials whenever possible. Experimenting with everything from cardboard and plaster to cast-off building materials, the resulting artwork is always creative and one of a kind. Using different tools and techniques and drawing upon her graphic design background and love of minimalism, she has discovered her own unique style and a satisfying direction for her work.





Courtney Smith 2022-23 SARASOTA COUNTY HIGH SCHOOL TEACHER OF THE YEAR

Recently, our Scholarship Committee co-chairs had the privilege of touring the Visual and Performing Arts (VPA) campus at Booker High School. Courtney Smith, our enthusiastic tour guide, is the current VPA Director as well as Chair of the Dance Department. Courtney, a former VPA Booker student, was a multi-year scholarship recipient from the Fine Arts Society of Sarasota (FASS), receiving her first award in 2001 to attend the University of Florida. Courtney shared that receiving the scholarship allowed her to graduate debt-free. Furthermore, she states, "It confirmed a skill and talent in myself, securing the knowledge that I was, in fact, good enough to pursue my passion."

After graduating with a BFA in Dance, Courtney departed Florida to begin a dance career that took her around the country performing with local and national dance companies. She also performed with a Tampabased choreographer in Colombia, South America.

"Though I didn't speak Spanish and many didn't speak English, we shared an understanding through movement. We connected in ways that eliminated the barrier of language. It showed the power of dance at its finest!"

Courtney eventually chose to return to the arts community in Sarasota to teach at numerous studios, high schools and colleges in the region. She co-founded Moving Ethos Dance Company and co-directed it until 2015. With her heart clearly in education, she dedicated herself to her alma mater, Booker High School, as their Artistic Director of the Dance Program in 2018. Last year she was named High School Teacher of the Year in Sarasota County. She continues her own education path and this year will complete her Master's in Education.

Courtney states that providing financial support to young adults is so much more than simply paying a bill. "When you understand that someone believes in you so much that they are willing to put their money towards your future, the level of purpose and brilliance rises beyond measure." She believes support of the arts is a necessary component for the morality of our culture, for the connection of our people, and the hope of the future.


