At our March luncheon, she will share how she helped bridge the culture gap for artists of African descent and marginalized communities by founding the Suncoast Black Arts Collaborative, (SBAC) one of the newest arts organizations in Sarasota.

Michele holds degrees in fine arts, human resources and equal employment opportunity studies and is widely recognized for her visionary leadership. Her accomplishments include linking education and business in programs supporting institutional diversity, recruitment, awareness, and cultural learning.

Since her arrival in Sarasota in 2004, she has served on the boards of The Ringling Museum, The Hermitage Artist Retreat, Art Center Sarasota, Choral Artists of Sarasota and Community/Schools Partnership for the Arts. She is currently a Diversity Forum consultant for Florida Studio Theatre.

Her most recent accomplishment is SBAC's juried art exhibition, Visions in Black, exhibited in three locations in the area, including the Arts Advocates Gallery.


FROM YOUR PRESIDENT

Writing Workshop: "SEVEN SACRED PAUSES"

MARCH 9, 2023 | 1-3PM

This writing workshop will be based on the book Seven Sacred Pauses, in which Macrina Wiederkehr reinterprets the tradition of the seven monastic canonical hours for contemporary, nonsectarian life. She proposes that stopping to pay attention to the world around us seven times every day is an act of "to be" which is often crushed under our never-ending "to do."

The participants will use Wiederkehr's descriptions of the characteristics of the pauses and will write two poems, using Carson's poems as models, in



response to two of Butterfield's Seven Sacred Pauses paintings. We will focus on the art of being, the act of paying vigilant attention to the rhythms and patterns that are everywhere – everything is shot through with them. If we pay close attention to these patterns and rhythms, there is the possibility of harmonizing with them.

This is a separate event from the Art Talk. No previous writing experience required. Participants should bring pen & paper, or iPad, or laptop.

Art Talk: Five Visionaries Unite Sarasota's Visual Arts

Community

The Colony Artists put Sarasota on the map as a city with a vibrant visual arts scene. Now five visionary artists are building communities of artists to showcase their artworks.

In 2021, Jen Palmer created <u>Sarasota Studio</u> <u>Artists Association</u>, a dynamic community of 65+ artists that enables visitors to meet artists in their studios, learn about their creative inspiration and directly purchase their art.

<u>Creative Liberties</u> was founded by Elizabeth Goodwill and Barbara Gediman to provide services and affordable studio space.

Participating artists work in a communal space, enhancing the artists' ability to share ideas and help one another realize their visions. The basic concept has proven so successful, they have expanded to a second location with a classroom for monthly family art days where members of the community can create their own art.

Craig Palmer recently opened <u>Palmer Modern</u> next door to Creative Liberties. His space features an art gallery and includes a studio for himself as well as well as affordable studios for five additional artists.



The two Creative Liberties sites and Palmer Modern are in the Limelight District, which is quickly transitioning into a major arts destination. There are now 27 artists within a few blocks, making it easy for visitors to walk from studio to studio. Having a high density of artists in one area is a win for the artists and those looking to purchase local art. These artists and jewelry designer Judy Levine will be our panelists.

DOCENT TOUR OF ELLING EIDE RESEARCH CENTER AND PRESERVE

APRIL 25, 2023 | 10:00-11:30AM

Our tour guide will take us through the acclaimed building designed by Guy Peterson, showcasing Asian artifacts collected by the Eide Family. These include a Chinese silk tapestry from the 18–19th century (Qing Dynasty), Japanese screens, ceramics, Chinese figurines, Asian and calligraphy scrolls, paintings, and a restored Persian mural ceiling in the dining room. In the library you will see Mr. Eide's collection of books and journals.



Then we will visit the preserve and learn about the history of the property and enjoy the beauty of the trees and rare plants on site.

The Elling Eide Center Research Library and Preserve opened its doors in the fall of 2016. The Center provides scholars and students with opportunities to research Chinese and East Asian culture, history, and art on a pristine nature preserve.


