The Collection Committee

As the Fine Arts Society begins a Board transition, the newly formed Collection Committee will begin issuing regular reports to the membership via our monthly Newsletter. In the past administration, with the advent of the Hintzpeter bequest, we found it necessary to group together all committees with art objectives to manage our Art Collection at the Van Wezel more efficiently. Included under the Collection umbrella will be the Acquisition, Docents and Task Force Committees.

Our current plan includes a complete overview of our Collection, such as its condition, value, placement, security, and decisions to acquire or de-access art pieces. The first of three examinations is about to be completed. Mark Ormond, Curator at the Ringling College of Art and Design, is assessing the Collection. His report will include how the Collection looks as a whole and make suggestions on how to improve it going forward.

The next step is having the committee review his information and decide which pieces should be appraised. Daphne Rosenzweig, a certified appraiser and professor of art

at Ringling College, will then do an appraisal of those pieces. After a review, the committee will convene again to decide what items might be insured. Insurance agencies will then be interviewed. As you can see, it is a complex and ongoing process.

As a committee, we are also charged with finding new acquisitions, developing new places to display the art, and continuing the docent program at the Van Wezel. There will be many new ideas and events that will surround our Collection to help increase its visibility to the community and our membership.

Fine Arts Strategic Planning Workshop

At the workshop May 13, Fine Arts Society leaders will start the Strategic Planning process celebrating where we are today with such questions as:

"What is Fine Arts best known for?"

"What is unique about us?"

"How important is the Collection?"

"How do our scholarships impact our community?"

"Our grants?"

"Where are we most effective?"

"Why did you join Fine Arts? Accept a leadership position?"

And then we will discuss such questions as:

"Is our name relevant?"

"Who are our organizational competitors?"

"Who are our likely partners?"

"What is our most urgent issue?

During this Workshop, four clusters will be created: Collection, Member Activities, Sustainability, and Communication. Each leader will be working with others in their cluster to write the action steps needed to achieve their objectives in the two years ahead. Those are actions beyond routine responsibilities. They will address changes in resources, technology and the community, so that we will not just carry on but will thrive as we go forward into the next fifty years.

Anne Marie Russell, Executive Director of SMOA, will speak to the Board May 9 as a kick off to this process. She will provide insight on how the art world in Sarasota sees us and the various opportunities and challenges facing other arts organizations in the region.
