

FROM YOUR PRESIDENT

It is an honor to have been elected president of Arts Advocates.

Arts Advocates has its roots in the Sarasota art scene pre and post WWII. Thanks to John Ringling having started an art school (and mostly glorious weather), painters flocked here to study, enjoy the beaches, the scenery, and the comradery of other painters. They created and left a legacy. It is this legacy of the Sarasota Art Colony.

In the short five years I've lived here, I've seen enormous change in our city. Change is inevitable but I don't think it should totally erase the past. Fifty-five years ago, some prescient Sarasotans decided the same thing. They sought to capture and preserve our Colony Art — the art that had defined our city since the 1930s. They formed the Fine Arts Society and purchased representative art. A few years ago, we changed our name to "Arts Advocates" to indicate that we broadened our scope to embrace all the arts and, consequently, today, with an expanded collection, we are part of Sarasota's thriving art community.

Arts Advocates reaches into the community in many ways: we conduct talks and tours with artists and art historians; we display artwork

in our Gallery; we have monthly luncheons in season that highlight our broad and diverse art scene; and we award scholarships to Sarasota and Manatee County undergraduates studying art — visual, performing arts, creative writing, and architecture. I see it as my responsibility to Arts Advocates to stay true to this mission.

I hope you will continue to join us as we continue to grow, diversify, and connect with the arts.

Azara Ballet is a nonprofit professional dance company creating classical and contemporary works for the Sarasota/Manatee community. Its focus is to change ballet culture for the better with mental and emotional wellness through the lens of dance by encouraging body positivity and unique individuality.

Founders Kate Flowers and Martin Roosaare started this organization with the goal of uplifting people through dance. Kate was unable to pursue her dream career as a

professional dancer. The unhealthy aspects that sometimes exist within ballet culture led her to suffer from eating disorders that turned into drug abuse by age 16. After a decade without dance, she focused on recovery and now, fully dedicated to Azara Ballet, she has fulfilled her lifelong desire to dance professionally, to change the ballet narrative for the better, and to inspire others to never give up on their dreams.

Martin has danced for the last 20+ years with over a decade of accomplishment in his professional career. After being diagnosed with autism at age 28, he was able to reflect on the many struggles he faced as a young, undiagnosed child. He now attributes much of his success and happiness to the structure and discipline of ballet and its ability to be a non-verbal form of expression.

Kate and Martin are passionate about being inclusive and representative of the LGBTQ+ and neurodivergent communities through their outreach programs as well as bringing arts education to the community in a revolutionary, body positive and mentally healthy way.

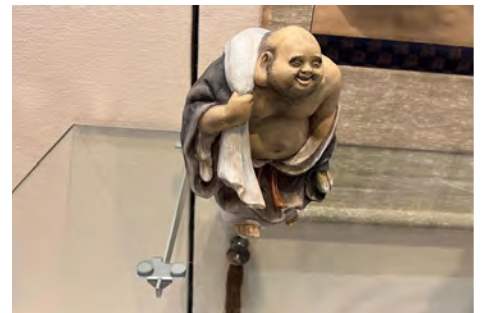
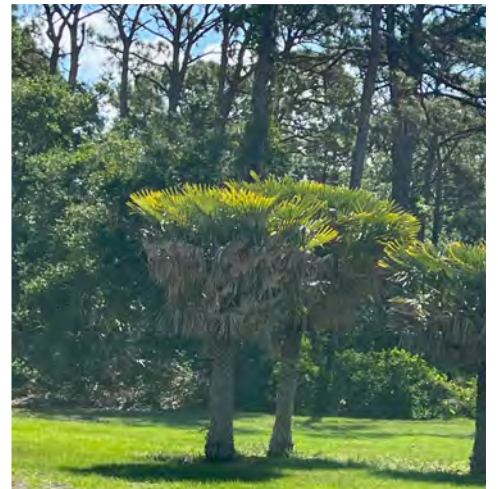

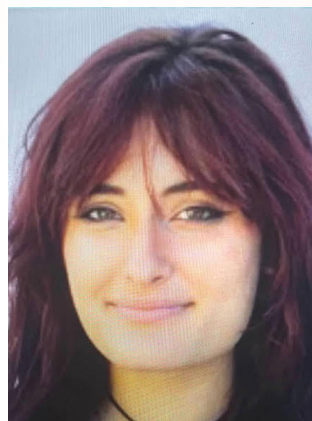
social media to market her work and eventually have her own studio.

THE DREAM

When our founding members began collecting art by Florida artists, they envisioned establishing a special museum to house the collection. In the interim, the Van Wezel and the City of Sarasota generously provided an exhibit space until a museum-style facility became a reality.

The addition of the gallery in the Crossings at Siesta Mall was one step toward realizing this dream. However, Arts Advocates must continue its efforts to interest a foundation, investor, or philanthropist in purchasing or donating a building they own where we may preserve, house, and exhibit this historic and unique collection.

In May of last year, The Benderson Corporation purchased the mall where our Arts Advocates Gallery is located. Benderson has not been forthcoming about their future plans for this property, and we are leasing gallery space on a month-to-month basis.
